What is a cookie?

Cookies are small files containing letters, numbers, punctuation marks and other technical characters, which are stored on your device (computer, mobile phone, tablet, smart TV, etc.) when you visit certain websites. These are IT data that facilitate the use of websites; they are sent by the web server to the user's browser, stored on the user's device, and returned to the server by the browser with every request directed to it. They do not contain executable files, viruses or spyware, nor do they access data stored on the user's hard drive.

Cookies generally contain the following: the domain name for which they are valid, the storage duration, and the stored value. Among other things, they enable recognition of the user's device and browser, thereby facilitating the display of content tailored to the visitor's needs and supporting basic browsing functions, such as ensuring coherent sessions. They also support the preparation of visitor statistics while preserving user anonymity.

We do not store personally identifiable data in cookies; however, to enhance the user experience, we use encrypted information derived from such data. For example, they help us identify and resolve errors, or determine what interesting related products we would like to draw your attention to during your browsing of our website.

Cookies that are strictly necessary for the operation of the website, as well as cookies supporting anonymous visitor statistics, are loaded already during the first visit. The user cannot influence this.

Cookies applied for the purpose of enhancing the user experience and for marketing activities are loaded only after consent given in the cookie notification 'box'. This consent may be withdrawn at any time by means of the link located in the browser or in the website's footer, or by deleting the 'cookieconsent_status'.

If, at a later stage, you contact us via a form – with your express consent – on one of our websites where cookies are used, it is possible that using these cookies we may learn about your website visits preceding the submission of the form. This is done for the purpose of improving the user experience.

If you have accepted the cookie notice on our websites, the notice will not appear again until you delete the 'cookieconsent_status' cookie using the link located in the browser or in the website's footer.

If you decide to restrict, block or delete cookies applied by a website, you can do so via your browser. As every browser is different, please refer to the Help menu of your browser (or your mobile phone's user manual) for information on how to change cookie settings.

4. Exercising Data Subject Rights

Where a data subject has submitted a request to the controller regarding the exercise of the rights described in Section 3, the controller shall respond and inform the data subject about the measures taken in relation to the request without undue delay, but in any event within one month of receipt of the request. Where necessary, that period may be extended by a further two months.

Where the controller does not take action on the request of the data subject, the controller shall inform the data subject without delay, but at the latest within one month of receipt of the request, of the reasons for not taking action and of the possibility of lodging a complaint with a supervisory authority and of seeking judicial remedy.

5. Lodging a Complaint

6. Judicial Redress

Provisions on judicial redress are contained in Act CXII of 2011 on the Right to Informational Self-Determination and Freedom of Information.

The data subject may bring legal proceedings against the controller before a court if, in their view, the controller has infringed the rules on the processing of personal data. The action may be brought — at the data subject's choice — before the court having jurisdiction in the place of their domicile or place of residence. A party that would otherwise lack legal standing may also be a party to the proceedings. The data protection authority may intervene in the proceedings in favour of the data subject.

Any person who has suffered material or non-material damage as a result of an infringement of the General Data Protection Regulation is entitled to receive compensation from the controller or the processor for the damage suffered. The controller or processor shall be exempt from liability if it proves that it bears no responsibility whatsoever for the event giving rise to the damage.
